Ifa Iwa (Lesson 2) Understanding *Adura*: Part II Vscript Draft

Greetings: Oriire fun owo! (Glad Tidings to you!)

Ago Ori mi! Ago Egun mi! Ago Ori<u>s</u>a mi! Ago Imole! Ago Ifa! <u>S</u>amona oro mi, iro mi, ati i<u>s</u>e mi sodo Aseyori!

Listen my Ori! Listen my Ancestors! Listen my Ori<u>s</u>a! Listen Irunmole! Listen Ifa! Guide my words, my thoughts, and my actions towards success!

In this lesson, Part II of Understanding *Adura*, we will discuss **Prayers of Declarations** and **Prayers of Petitioning or Summoning**. I recommend you listen to Understanding *Adura*, Part I so that you can fully comprehend this lesson.

In part one we discussed **Prayers of Praise** and **Prayers of Gratitude**, and how these types of *Adura* can affect our *Ase Ami* (Energy Signature).

Let's discuss **Prayers of DECLARATION (siso)**:

Expressions of **Praise** and **Gratitude** (covered in Part I of Understanding *Adura*) should lead you to make certain declarations regarding your relationship to *Olodumare* and the *Imole* (Spiritual Entities).

A **declaration** (sis<u>o</u>) is a positive, formal, or explicit statement, <u>a</u> proclamation that we firmly hold something to be true.

You may make declarations of your <u>character</u>, your <u>lineage</u>, and your <u>purpose</u> in life, and other things about which you have convictions.

You can make declarations of your willful choice to align your physical *Ori* with your Spiritual *Ori*, your *Ori Apere*, your *Oriinu*, (i.e. your State of Perfection).

In *Ile Awo Orisa* our declarations generally begin with '*Emi ni*...' (I am...). Think about how these particular declarations (siso) might shift your *Ase Ami*!

In these first three, we're talking to Olodumare: *EMI NI EDA E!* I am your creature, your creation.

EMI NI OMO E! I am your child!

EMI NI IRAN<u>se</u> e!

I am your servant!

Here, we are affirming our sense of Isopo, connectivity with the Divine:

EMI OKAN TI ASE! ASE NI TI MI, NIGBABOGBO!

I am one with the Ase! The Ase is with me, always!

EMI OKAN TI ORISUN! ORISUN NI TI MI, NIGBABOGBO!

I am one with the SOURCE! The SOURCE is with me always!

And here, we are declaring our sense of responsibility and purpose for coming into the world: *EMI NI ALAKOSO TI AYANMO IPIN!* I am the master of my destiny!

EMI OLUKONI TI ENIA!

I am a teacher of the people!

Also, we might declare:

A wa gegebi Eniyan, A wa ni Olodumare yan, Lati lo tun ile aye se. Eni - a yan ni wa! We as human beings, We are the God's elect, Designated to renew the world. We are the Chosen ones!

MO JUBA ...! I humble myself...!

Now let's discuss **Prayers of Petitioning** or **Summoning**:

PETITIONING (*ibere*) **or SUMMONING** (*pase*) / **INVOKING and EVOKING**:

Na Wa (Expansion) is your *Ogun Ibi*, (birthright). You come into this world to <u>explore</u>, to <u>experiment</u>, to <u>learn</u>, to <u>grow</u>, to <u>succeed</u> in achieving the purpose for which you came. This is your *Ogun Ibi*.

And, your *Ori*, your *Egun*, your *Orisa*, the *Imole*, your *Egbe* (soul community), and *Ifa* (the nature of creation), all support you on your journey in the *L'oja* (marketplace).

Petitioning and **Summoning** are part of your *Ogun Ibi*! Remember the three (3) Declarations that we mentioned earlier:

EMI NI EDA E! I am your creature, your creation.

EMI NI OMO E! I am your child!

EMI NI IRAN<u>se</u> e!

I am your servant!

A **petition** is a formal and respectful request addressed to an entity that you believe has the <u>authority</u> and <u>power</u> to grant that which you are seeking.

Summoning is calling upon an entity of <u>authority</u> and <u>power</u>, to do something that you are specifically seeking. It is also to call for the presence of, as by <u>command</u>, <u>call</u>, or as we say, to <u>invoke</u> or <u>evoke</u>.

This is the part of *Adura* when you **openly speak to those you have called into assembly**, informing them of your needs, and asking for their support, and asking them to accept your humble but sincere offering of *omi tutu* or some other *ebo* (sacrifice).

In *Ile Awo Orisa* we have several **Orin ti Isipaya**! (Chants of manifestation and invocations!) Our most commonly used **pe** (call) is:

MO GBADURA SI ATI PE JADE ASE TI...

I invoke and evoke the *Ase* of ... (name of *Orisa*, ancestor, **Ori Baba**, **Ori Iya**, **Ori Egbe**)

What is it that you are seeking?

• To avert some illness or tragedy.

- To fine a meaningful relationship.
- To have healthy children.
- To achieve financial success.
- To overcome emotional difficulties.
- Guidance
- Protection

Express yourself openly and honestly. Like talking to someone you know always supports your best interests.

In these two lessons, **Understanding** *Adura* **Part I & II**, we have discussed Prayers of Praise (*iyin*), **Gratitude** (*imore*), **Declarations** (sis<u>o</u>), and **Petitioning** (*ibere*) or **Summoning** (*pase*).

These are the four fundamental elements of *Adura* as taught in *Ile Awo Orisa*! I invite you to join us on this continuing journey of establishing your *Ifa Iwa* (*Ifa* Practice).
